 distant, to make and ^{ordains} this my last will & Testament
 1st I most Humbly resign my soul to God & my Body to the
 Earth to be decently Buried as to the worldly property which
 has pleased Almighty God to bestow on me, I do hereby bequeath
 First I Give & bequeath the Negro Girls Betty & Elizabeth
 to my Beloved wife Ann Howard and her heirs for ever Provided
 she remains single 2nd I Give & bequeath to my said Be-
 loved wife my Home Plantation: deeded to me by Benjamin
 Synn & his wife to which are Subjoined two small Tracts (viz) about
 five acres of land Bought of Michael Campbells, whose Bond for the
 same shall be found Among my papers, & A survey of forty
 Acres patented in my name Also the megr is, Harry Henry
 & Stephens; Also my whole Stock of Horses, Cattle, Sheep, Hogs
 & all my farming utensils, Hoes, & Kitchen furniture & Gener-
 ally the residue of my property not mentioned in this my will,
 N. B. The first Legacy made to my wife & her Heirs shall stand
 good only during her widow hood, But if she marries, then & from
 that ^{date} the said Legacy shall Devolve Immediately on the Heir
 Stephen Theodore Bading; Rev. Charles Nerinck & the then
 Roman Catholic Bishop of Kentucky, appointed according to
 the rules of the Roman Catholic Church; to be Enjoyed by them
 and the Survivors and Survivor and the Lawful Heirs of the
 last Survivor for ever; the other Legacies made to my wife are
 after her widow hood or at her Death to devolve likewise on
 the just named Gentlemen, and the Survivors and the Lawful
 Heirs of the last Survivor for ever 3rd I Give and Bequeath
 to my beloved niece Mary Cifel & her Heirs forever a negro child
 named Mona About fourteen months old Also a Bed & furniture
 a Cow & calf & my Bureau; the whole to be Enjoyed by her when
 she marries; Provided however that she will not marry without

the free Consent of my wife & of her mother if of the marriage without said Consent, the whole legacy shall Immediately Devolve on the Gentlemen named in the above article to them & the Survivors & the lawful heirs of the last survivor, But, if the remains single, she shall enjoy this legacy at the death of my wife or if being widowed to promote the public Good that my Estate should be conducive to the interest of virtue & religion I do will, Give, Bequeath and Devise to the said Rev. Stephen Theodore Bardin, Rev. Charles Nininck & the then Roman Catholic Bishops, of Kentucky, the following property to be enjoyed by them and the survivors, and survivors the lawful heirs of the last survivor for ever, To wit the land and Plantation I Bought of Charles Campbell and a negroman named Clemmy Provided they shall discharge a bond of three hundred and eighty five Dollars and eighty cents to w^{it} H. Hyges of Bardstown and one Hundred & forty seven and one half Dollars to my sister in law Clean Ciguel and Provided my wife shall have during her single life the privilege of Any Timber and of the Orchard &c. My other debts, if any shall be paid out of the Produce of my Plantation which can be spared, and out of my stock Lastly I do hereby constitute and appoint my said Beloved wife Ann Howard Executrix of this my last will and testament. In testimony whereof I have hereunto set my hand and affixed my seal this twenty eight day of May one thousand eight hundred and Ten.
