Three Children shall have one Equal Part in their share
and Bequeath unto my beloved Daughter Sarah Spalding
one Bed and Furniture and Cow and calf.

I nominate constitute and appoint my Beloved wife
Rachel Clark my whole and sole Executrix of this my
