1814.

the 15<sup>th</sup> of April 1814.  
This Inventory & appraisal of the Estate of Thos.  
Brewer Dec<sup>d</sup> was returned & ordered to be recorded

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Nelson County July 22<sup>nd</sup> 1808  
In the name of God Amen. I William Boyle s<sup>r</sup>  
knowing the uncertainty of life & the certainty of Death  
when it shall please God to call do make cidean & declare this  
my last will & Testament. And First I bequeath my soul to  
God, who gave it & my Body to the dust from whence it  
was taken to be decently committed to the ground after Death  
whenever it shall please my Executors hereafter named. I will  
& Bequeath that my Estate both Personal & Real shall continue  
undivided till after the Death of my wife Mary Boyle.  
Secondly, I will & Bequeath My Daughter Melly Duncan five  
Pounds. Thirdly, I will and Bequeath to my Son Henry Boyle  
five Pounds. Fourthly, To my Son Andrew Boyle I Bequeath five  
Pounds. Fifthly, I will & Bequeath to my Son William Boyle  
Just all my Estate both personal & Real out of which he is  
to pay the above legacies & the following, To my daughter  
Margaret, I will & Bequeath to her five Pounds together with a  
Horse Saddle & Bridle, Two Beds with their Bedding & Fur-  
niture - a Cow & Calf, two Cows & Lambs Loom & gears, a yarn  
& Linen wheel. I will & appoint my Son William Boyle  
my Executor to this my last will & Testament, In witness  
whereof I have hereunto set my hand & Seal this twenty second  
Day of July one thousand Eight hundred & Eight.
