Item 1st I Commit my soul to almighty God and my body to the dust by a decent burial and after all my just debts are paid I give and bequeath my worldly possessions in the following manner to wit: Item 2nd I give and bequeath to the lawfully begotten Heirs of my son Thomas Hobbs by his first wife with who now resides or lately did reside in the State of Maryland the whole balance of the Plantation I now live on in Nelson County on the waters of Simpsons creek and commonly called the Burnt station after paying off one hundred and Thirteen acres in manner and form herein afterwards directed for my son Nathan Hobbs also a negro boy called a gason and a negro girl called milly son and daughter to my negro woman Fanny. The whole of the above named land and slaves or will'd to the aforesaid heirs of my son Thomas and his wife with their the said Heirs are to receive on the express condition that they suffer their said father Thomas Hobbs and with their mother to enjoy all the benefits thereof and remain in peaceable possession of the said land and negroes during both and each of their the said Thomas Hobbs and with his wife's natural lives because it is my will and pleasure and meaning that my said son Thomas Hobbs & with his wife shall each have a life estate therein
Item 3rd I give and bequeath to my son Zachariah Hobbs of Washington County Kentucky independent of the land already deeded to him by me whereon he now lives a negro
