paid and funeral expenses. I give and bequeath in the following manner
Item 1. I give unto my son John Dran one Gray horse sold now one year
old for the use of his son Thomas Dran.

Item 2. I then give unto my son Richards Dran all the rest of my
Estate Consisting of house hold furniture horses cattle hogs with
all my farming utensils and I do appoint and ordain my son
Richard Dran my full and sole Executor to this my last will and
testament. Given under my hand and signed by me this 7
may in the year of our Lord 1810. in the presence of
