in memory though weak in body do make and ordain this my last
will and Testament as follows: First I recommend my soul to God
hoping through the merits of my blessed redeemer to have full re-
mission of all my sins: secondly my body to be decently interred at
the discretion of my Executors hereafter named: now as to what
temporal Estate which God in his mercy has bestowed on me
I give and bequeath as follows. I give and bequeath to my beloved
wife Mary my plantation containing one hundred and fifty acres
of Land for her use and benefit during life and then to be divided
to my children equally I also give and bequeath to my beloved
wife Mary my household and kitchen furniture together with my

farming utensils and also my stock of horses cattle and sheep
for the maintainance and benefit of my wife and children and
lastly I nominate Richard Nutt my executor of this my last will
and Testament as witness my hand and seal this 2nd day of
January 1814
