In the name of God Amen, I James Brown of the County of Nelson and State of Kentucky being sick of Body but of sound memory do make this my last will and testament in the manner and form following (to wit) my desire is that my just debts be paid as soon as the nature of the case will admit of and as much of my personal property be sold off as will answer that purpose. Then, my Desire is that my Beloved wife keep all my Estate, Real and personal (after paying the debts) in her hands to do as she pleases with so long as she remains a widow; and raise and school my Children in the best manner she can and the nature of the case will admit, and when they come of age and leave her if she has anything to spare to give as much to one as another so as to make all equal and at her death all the property to be equally divided among my four Children (to wit) Cinderella Brown, Budson Edwards Brown, Samuel Staples Brown & Sally Ann Brown. But in case she chooses to marry then in that case the property to be divided and she to have one third, the other two thirds thirds to
