1st I give that all my debts be lawfully paid 2^d I give and bequeath to my son Richard ten dollars 3^d I give and bequeath to my daughter Margaret Anderson ten dollars 4th I give and bequeath to my daughter I also give and bequeath to my son William ten dollars 5th I give and bequeath to my son William ten dollars 6th I give and bequeath to my wife Wiley all my estate real and personal as she may bequeath to my son William Napier the above bequeathments I give and bequeath to my grand daughter Laura Napier twenty dollars it is my will also that my son William if he returns from the army to have all my estate real and personal at the death of his mother the above bequeathments if he never returns it is my will that all my estate real and personal be divided equally among the above named persons at the death of my wife Wiley it is my will also that the above be not paid until the death of my wife Wiley I do appoint executor of my last will and Testament and do revoke all other wills by me hereof made in writing
