At a County Court held for Nelson County on Monday the
19th day of April 1813.

This Settles account with the Guardians of the
Estate of Ben Grayson was returned and ordered to record.
Estate Ben Grayson no. 66

Ex. In the name of God Amen. I John Cummins of the
County of Nelson being very sick and weak in body but
of perfect mind and memory do make and ordain this my
last will and Testament (that is to say) principally and
first of all. I recommend my soul into the hands of
almighty God that gave it and my body I recommend to
the earth from whence it came - and as touching such
worldly Estate wherewith it has pleased God to bless me
this life. I give demise and dispose of the same in the
following manner and form (viz). First I give and
bequeath unto my well beloved son Samuel Cummins
one hundred acres of Land in Nelson County which shall include
the one half of my two hundred acres to be laid off at that
end of the land which joins a Military line.
Secondly I give & bequeath unto my well beloved son James
Cummins one hundred acres of Land in Nelson County
which shall include the other half of the two hundred
and fourteen pounds in good trade to be paid out of my
Other property and one horse Saddle and bridle when he
comes to the age of Eighteen years.
Thirdly I give unto my well beloved wife Elizabeth Cummins
the place wherupon she now lives during her natural life with
the Stock Mirens but to make a sale of what things are
not necessary in the House or about the farm and all debts
due or demands that I have against any one and to pay
any Just debts that may be against me and at her death
the whole to be Equally divided among my other Children
(Samuel and James having no part in this division)

So that the account I have against any of them for papers
already given them may be paid. Comitted in their part of the
said Division. and Lastly I constitute my said wife James
Cummins & William Steele the sole Executors of this my last will and
Testament and I do hereby utterly revoke and disannul all
and every Other former Testaments, wills, legacies, bequests and
bequests by me in any wise mentioned, written or bequeathed.
Ratifying and confirming this and no other my last will &
Testament. In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand
and seal the twentieth day of January one thousand eight
hundred & thirteen.

In the name of God Amen John Grayson of the County of
Nelson and State of Kentucky being debilitated in body but of
sound memory and understanding do constitute and ordain
this my last will and Testament.
First I write and bequeath to my three sons namely James
Gravin Brown Gravin John Gravin all the lands that I
possess to be Equally divided between the three.
Secondly I write and bequeath to my son Solomon Gravin one
hog mare and my saddle the mare four or five years of age
Thirdly I write and bequeath to my three eldest Daughters namely
Mary Gravin Elizabeth Gravin happy Gravin one bed and
furniture and one cow to each of them and all the
other things we are belonging to be equally divided

- between the three Namas.
14. It is my will that my Daughter Nancy Cravin have one Small steer about five years old.
15. It is my will that my son Solomon Cravin have
- a) bay steed four years old.
16. It is my will that the Ballance of my hogges sheep and hogs be equally divided between my three sons Solomon Cravin Hanson Cravin and Henry Cravin.
17. It is my will that my son James Cravin and son Reason Cravin have one head steer apiece the other two sons Nancy Cravin and the other to Deborah Cravin.
18. It is my will that my three oldest daughters have one linen wheel apiece.
19. It is my will that my Daughter Nancy have the bullock.
20. It is my will that my daughter Deborah have a cart.
21. It is my will that my sons James have a table and
- " Saw Reason one.
22. It is my will that the small House with small place and outhouse that was mentioned in the State laws of my Hapges be for my son James Cravin.
23. It is my will that my two sons James and Reason have two plows single trees gears, ox and four hoes equally divided between the two mentioned.
24. It is my will that my daughter Nancy have also the Woodmen wear such as hats piggins and chains.
25. It is my will that my son Reason have one ten Gallon Kettle and hoes.
26. It is my will that my daughter Nancy have
- " one three gallon pot and hoes.
27. It is my will that my Daughter Deborah have
- " one dished Oven and Skillett and bails and flint forks.
28. It is my will that the chairs be equally divided
- " between my two sons James and Reason.
29. It is my will that my son Solomon have my watch.
30. It is my will that my wearing apparel be equally
- " divided between my three oldest sons.
31. It is my will that an order that I have on James
- " Expell for twenty five Dollars be equally divided
 - " between my son Solomon and daughter Nancy.
32. It is my will while the family and stock continues on the plantation they are to be separated with the Cows and Bacon and after the family

and stock is broke up the Ballance of horn and Bacon to be sold and the money put to Interest for my youngest Daughter Polly Cravin.

33. It is my will that my Daughter Polly have twenty Dollars out of money due son from James before an put on Interest with the other.

34. It is my will and desire after all debts that is due mine collected and my Debt is paid the Ballance to be put to interest and equally divided between my two youngest sons James Cravin and Henry Cravin.

35. It is my will that my son James have the wooden wheel, wheel bar and Sifter and all the Tubs and Loom.

36. It is my will all the spinning that is due about the house should be given and equally divided among all my children except James and Reason.

To this my last will and Testament I appoint my son James Cravin this 17 day of March 1813. There subs at my hand and affixed my seal.
