At a County Court held for Nelson County on Monday the 15th day of July 1801 on the motion of Jacob King who made the following oath (viz.) This day Jacob King made oath in open Court that John Sutherland and Nancy his wife two of the subscribing witnesses to the will of Peter King and as he believes is unable to attend Court in order to prove said will and may as he believes never be well enough to appear in open Court to attest said will. - Jacob King it is therefore ordered that a writ be issued to take the Depositions of said John and Nancy for the proof said will Test Ben Grayson &c. The Commonwealth of Kentucky to Justice Hull and squire a Justice of the peace in and for the County of Nelson greeting know you that in trusting to your fidelity and prudence in diligently examining taking and certifying the

depositions of John Sutherland and Nancy his wife subscribers of said will to the last will and Testament of Peter King deceased and command you that at such certain time and place as you shall appoint you and the said John and Nancy to appear before you and then examine upon their oaths or affirmations whether Peter King the Testator in the annexed will signed and published the said will in writing as his last will and Testament or whether some other person signed it by his directions and whether the said Testator was of disposing mind and memory and at that time and whether the said John and Nancy subscribed their names thereto in his presence and at his request and their examination into our Nelson County Court then you certify and send inland returning also to us this will with the annexed will or writing without delay. Witness Benjamin Grayson clerk of our said Court at the Courthouse in said County the 21st day of July 1801 in the 23^d year of the Commonwealth.

The depositions of John and Anne Sutherland taken at their residence in Nelson County in obedience to the within order to wit the twenty first day of July Enight hundred and fourteen that upon John Sutherland being duly sworn depose and say that Peter King the Testator to the annexed will did sign and publish the said original will together with the said amendments thereto as his last will and Testament and that at the time of the said signatures and publications the said Testator Peter King was in his proper understanding and the said Anne Sutherland being also duly sworn depose and say that the said Testator Peter King did in her presence sign and publish the said will or amendment to the said annexed will and Testament and that at the time of signing and publishing the said the said Testator Peter King was in his proper mind
