In the name of God Amen I Samuel Brown of the County of Nelson and State of Kentucky being sick and weak of body do make this my last will and testament in the manner and form following, my Request is that all my just debts be first paid, I give and bequeath to my beloved wife Maria with those the Ditching house wherein I live for & during her natural life, my son Nathaniel Brown is to furnish my wife with a full and comfortable maintenance as long as she lives, from the produce of my farm, and my son Nathaniel is also to furnish and maintain my three daughters namely Nancy, Mary and Abigail, so long as they remain on my farm, now the family, in the same manner as he is to accommodate his wife, there is already set apart for my before mentioned three daughters a house land and saddle a bed and furniture for each of them which they are to have together with their wearing apparel, and my son Nathaniel is to pay to each of my Daughters before mentioned when they see cause to go away from the family, twenty five pounds in trade to each, I give and bequeath to my wife one black mare called the Ditching light all the rest of my horse creatures, and before mentioned together with every species of stock that I now possess

to remain for my farm for the use of the family
I give and bequeath to my son Nathaniel Brown
all my tract of land known as such containing
One hundred and ninety six acres to him and his
heirs forever, my son in law Miles Mills having
with my consent settled on a part of my land, my
wish and desire is that he shall remain on it unmo-
lested for five years and no longer I have therefore
given to my sons that are married namely John
Brown Johnson Brown James Brown and Richard
Brown what I then could conveniently spare
which I allot for their share of my estate my wish
and desire is that after my wife's death that all
my movable property that has not been bequeathed,
to be sold at twelve months credit and the money
arising therefrom to be equally divided between my sons
Nathaniel and my three daughters Nancy Sany and
Spawell, my daughter Elizabeth Mills having already
got the legacy that I allotted for her, and lastly
I appoint my Cousin Nathaniel Brown and my
neighbour John Hinson Executors of this my last will
