I have I do hereby will and devise, ^{that} all my just debts and funeral expenses be paid out of my estate by my Executors hereafter named.

I have I give and bequeath to my loving daughter and only son of John Howard of living and my loving Daughters Rebecca, Jane and Sarah Howard. Two negroes James and Peter and Catharine to be sold by my executor to the highest bidder and the money arising therefrom be equally divided among them.

I have I give and bequeath to the children of my son Joseph Howard Dec^d a certain Negro boy named James and a certain negro girl named Lufford ^(sister) them and their issue to be equally divided among the said children of Joseph Howard at their coming of age.

I have I give and bequeath to my Howard widow of Joseph Howard dec^d a certain negro named May free and during the time the said Joseph Howard's children may continue to live with her or be under her jurisdiction it is my will and desire that if the S^d Ann Howard should marry before the youngest child of S^d Joseph Howard comes of age, that she still keep the S^d May in her possession and the profits arising from S^d May be applied to the education and maintenance the S^d youngest child of S^d Joseph Howard dec^d and after the maintenance of S^d children, I will and desire that after the maintenance of the said children the S^d Ann Howard shall keep the S^d May during her natural life and after her death I will and bequeath S^d May may, to Samuel Howard youngest son of Joseph Howard dec^d.

I have I give and bequeath to my Daughter Sarah Howard this two negroes she now has in her possession known by the names of Anthony and Fanny to her and her heirs forever. Lastly I do hereby constitute and appoint my friend Nathaniel Brown Executor of this my last will and testament.
