my beloved wife Elizabeth Smith all my Estate both real and personal during her life. I now give and bequeath to my son Benjamin Daugherty Black all the lands belonging to the tract where on I now live own and above one hundred acres to be laid off to him on the lower end of my land to be hers forever. I now give and bequeath to my son George Smith twenty five acres of land adjoining S^r George Smith's land which is to be his from this day and forever. I now give and bequeath to each of the heirs of my son Martin Smith, namely Polly, Ann and Rachel five Shillings each to be theirs forever. I now give and bequeath to my son and daughter namely George Jacob Elizabeth and Emma, after the death of my wife, all my Estate both real and personal to be divided equally amongst them all except Jacob who I wish to have twenty five pounds up than the rest to belong to them and their heirs forever. I leave my son George the sole executor of my Estate in writing which I have set my hand and seal this 27th day of October 1811.
