Ex² In the name of God Amen I William Butler of Nelson County and State of Kentucky being very weak in body but of perfect mind and memory thanks be to God calling into mind the mortality of my body and believing that it is appointed for all men once to die, do make and ordain this my last will and testament that is to say principally and first of all I recommend my soul into the hands of almighty God who gave it and my body I recommend to the earth to be buried in decent Christian burial nothing doubting but at the general resurrection I shall receive it again by the mighty Power of God and as touching such worldly estate wherewith it has pleased God to bless me with in this life I give, demise and dispose of in the following manner and form (To wit) I first give unto my beloved wife Susannah all my land and farming utensils and my negro woman

Barbary with one third of my property of every other description to be fully possessed by her during her natural life time or widowhood and no longer and at the decease or marriage of my wife I will and bequeath unto my son William Bethel all the above mentioned land and farming utensils to be fully possessed by him and his heirs forever and likewise all my wearing apparel and at the decease or marriage of my wife I will and bequeath unto my daughter Sally Barid wife of John Barid the above mentioned negro woman Barbary to be fully possessed by her and her heirs forever and all the rest of my property and out standing except one third which I allow my wife to have during her lifetime I will and bequeath to my three grand daughters children Elizabeth Bethel Emily Bethel William Bethel children of Daniel Bethel deceased to be equally divided among the three and the third part of my above property above mentioned which I allow my wife to keep during her lifetime I wish to be divided among my three above mentioned grand children at her death and I hereby constitute and ordain my son William Bethel and my friend James Hancock to be the sole executors of this my last will and testament and I her by these presents revoke and annul all former wills and testaments by me made in any way in witness whereof I have written set my hand and seal this twentieth day of July in the year of our Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ eighteen hundred and thirteen
