Napier is alive present the above bequeath is cancelled it is my will to give to my grand daughter Laura Napier thirty dollars if it is my will also that my son William if he returns from the army to have all my estate real and personal at the death of his mother the above bequeath is cancelled if he never returns it is my will that all my estate real and personal be divided equally among the above named by shares at the death of my wife Wiley it is my will also that the above be not paid until the death of my wife Wiley I do appoint executor of my last will and Testament and do revoke all other wills by me hereof made in writing whereof I subscribe at my hand and seal this 23^d day of October 1813

through the merits of my blessed Redeemer to have pardon and full remission of all my sins and
life Everlasting. Secondly my Body to be decently buried at the discretion of my dearer friends
around, and Thirdly my lawful debts to be paid out of my Estate - Now as to what Temporal
Estate which God in his mercies has bestowed on me I give as follows I give and bequeath to
my beloved wife Jane Haydon the plantation whereon I now live which I purchased of
Joseph Clayton containing forty four Acres and also the plantation which I purchased of
Matthew Smith containing fifty eight Acres I likewise give and bequeath to my own
beloved wife Jane Haydon three Negroes to wit Eliza, Susanna, Mary, Betty, David, Jack,
Sylvester, Edward and Steve. Moreover I give and bequeath to my beloved wife Jane Haydon all
my household and Kitchen furniture, Farming Utensils, my stock of horses, cattle and sheep, together
with my still and the tub, belonging to my distillery and I do give and bequeath to my beloved
wife Jane Haydon the Rape that may bear my land at the time of my Death. I then I give
and bequeath to my sister in law Mary Smith one Negro girl named Ann, Lady, Sonnet
and appoint my own beloved wife Jane Haydon executrix of this my last will & Testament -
The testimony whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this thirtieth day of July
one thousand eight hundred and fourteen.
