First, Whereas I have given unto my son Nicholas both free acres of land, and one house valued at twenty five pounds the land lying in Fayette County Pennsylvania and the above house valued in Pennsylvania currency, which is all I intend giving him until after my death when my estate is sold and divided.

Secondly, I have also given my son William both free acres of land lying in Fayette County Pennsylvania which is all I intend giving him, until after my death when my estate is sold and divided.

Thirdly, I also will and Bequeath unto my Daughter Elizabeth both twenty five Dollars more than her equal part of my estate after my death, when my estate is sold and divided.

Fourthly, I do likewise will and Bequeath unto my Daughter Margaret both Fifty Dollars more than her equal part of my estate after my death, when my estate is sold and divided.

Fifthly, I also will and Desire that my Grand Daughter Sally Cook shall have twenty Dollars out of my estate which I am justly indebted to her.

There is also an omission in regard to the portions left to my son William both of a horse, which I will and Desire he shall have after my death a horse to the amount of twenty five pounds Penn^a money and then come in for equal shares.

Sixthly and lastly, I also will and Desire that my three Daughters Susanna Fitch, Catharine Briner, and Barbara Wigam, shall come in for their equal parts after my death when Divided as above Divided. If there is any thing left I likewise constitute make and ordain my trusty friend Joseph Freeman the Executor of this my last will and testament and I do hereby utterly, disallow, revoke, and Disannul all and every other former Testaments, wills, legacies, Bequests, Executions, by me in any ways before named, written and Bequeathed, Ratified, and confirming this and no other to be my last will and testament. So witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this twenty fifth day of March one thousand eight hundred and eleven.
