E. In the name of God Amen this 29th day of April one thousand
eight hundred and four I Samuel Cornelius Ritchie of Nelson County
and State of Kentucky being weak in body but good and sound
memory thanks to be to Almighty God, and calling to mind
the uncertain state of this life and that all must give to death.
When it shall please God to call do make void and conclude
this my last will and Testament in manner & form following
And first I bequeath to Rejia my beloved wife my plantation
and stock of every kind also all my farming utensils & likewise
all my house hold and kitchen furniture during her natural life
or widowhood she being subject to the payment of all my just debts
and likewise to value all justly due to me but in case of her second

marriage the land to belong to John my eldest son the land to be
valued which together with the amount of all my other property
whereof I shall equally divided among all my children now or hereafter
of all to my beloved wife but in case of her second marriage before John my eldest son
bequeath the plantation to be rented out till he come of age then the
land to be his the rent of the land being likewise divided among them
all to wit John, Elyah, William, Cornelius and in case that
this my last will and Testament be brought into good effect, I app-
oint Rejia my beloved wife and Lewis Dupree my Executors as wit-
ness hereof I have set my hand and seal this day and year above written
Witness present

At a County Court held for Nelson County on the 20th day of February 1815
The above last will and Testament of Cornelius Ritchie deceased was pro-
ved by the oaths of Sarah Ritchie & Cornelius King two of those subscribing
witnesses thereto and ordered to be recorded and on the motion of Rejia Ritchie
and Lewis Dupree the executors therein named they having taken
the oath prescribed by law and executed bond with Charles Donohue
and Benjamin Robinson their securities in the penal sum of three
thousand dollars conditioned according to law, it is ordered that a certi-
ficate of Probate of said will be granted them

In the presence of God I, William J. Miller do, with my wife and children

 my own children. Also my will that my before named wife Elizabeth

 the payment of the British Debt on take Erie surviving the same
 I have given William Shadburn of Bardonia my former attorney
 Power from Capt. Rogers. Also my will that she shall have the
 one third part of all notes due me and the balance of the price of my
 my and other moneys arising from notes to be equally di-
 vided among my children Rebecca, Eva, Christina, Maria, Betsey,
 John, William. Secondly It is my will that William Shadburn
 have three of the twelve months of my prison money and other money
 from notes Twelve months without interest and any other
 Reasonable for his trouble that he may think Right
 Thirdly It is my will that William Shadburn and William Shadburn
