and appropriate the proceeds thereof to the use of my son William in Children to equally
divided between them namely Polly, Milly, Nancy, Hammond, Cora, Joseph also
Langford Haden, Fels, Sarah, Luanna - The tract of land to which I have a claim in
Henry County in Tennessee Lake Creek South and beneath to Peter Bays my son in law
Haden Edwards and my daughter Rebecca to be equally divided between them to them and
their heirs for ever and tract containing 339 acres - My desire and will is that all the
negroes as well as their future increase which I have written to my wife during her life at
her Death may be equally divided between my sons James John Eli and my son William
before mentioned in Children meaning the one fourth part for said son Children, and
in like manner at the death of my said wife I desire of all my stock, farming utensils
Household and Kitchen furniture except that part before disposed of and lastly
immovables constitute and appoint my beloved wife - Milly executrix, and my son James
Haden, my son John Haden and Haden Edwards Executors to this my last will and
Testament to act agreeable to the true intent and meaning thereof. Witness my hand

Thousand eight hundred & twelve

In the name of God Amen. This my last will and Testament (I Thomas Anderson of
myself weak of Body though of perfect mind and memory thanks be to
God for it. I recommend my soul to God and my Body to the earth from whence
it came to be buried in a Christian like form, and as to the worldly goods
that it has been please God to bless me with I dispose of in the following
manner. And first I have the following tract of Land to be sold to the highest
bidder on a twelve months credit for the payment of my just debts or part
said if it can be done by the Executors to advantage four hundred acres of Ad-
jacent Land on the South side of Tennessee River. Six hundred and seventy Acres on
South fork of Kentucky River, in the name of Sister. Alice One Thousand Acres
in the Wilderness on the old Trace entered in the name of David Anderson and
in Knox County. Then I give and bequeath unto my beloved wife Elizabeth
Anderson one third of all my personal property and my right to this Land that is
now live on which I purchased of Mr. Clark and Robert her son and if my said
wife does keep the children together with her I give and bequeath to her all the com-
provement on the Land that I bought of William Perrenger until the youngest come
of age with timber to support the said Land if found on the Land but and if she or
said wife does not keep the children together he shall be entitled to one third of
if the said improvement that I bought of the said William Perrenger. Then I
give and bequeath to my beloved children an equal share of all my goods and chattels
as they come of age except they stay together with their Mother. Mary Mary
Rebel, Agnes, Jefferson, John, David, George, Betty and Alice. And as much as
my wife now goes with as they leave their Mother occasionally she shall be bound
by my will and Testament she shall be bound
to pay them their proportionable part of my said estate if of age or Mary I do
