Ex² In the name of God Amen. This my last will and Testament I hereby give myself and of Body though of perfect mind and memory thanks to God for it. I recommend my soul to God and my Body to the earth from whence it came to be buried in a Christian like form, and as to the earthly goods that it has been please God to bless me with I dispose of in the following way. And first I have the following tract of Land to be sold to the highest bidder on a twelve months credit for the payment of my just debts or part of it if it can be done by the Executors to advantage four hundred acres of history Land on the South side of Tennessee River. Six hundred and seventy Acres on South fork of Kentucky River, in the name of Fisher. Nine One Thousand Acres in the Wilderness on the old Trace called in the name of David Anderson and in Wayne County. I have given and bequeath unto my beloved wife Elizabeth Anderson one third of all my personal property and my right to this Land that is now live on which I purchased of Mr. Clark and Robert her son and if my wife does keep the children together with her I give and bequeath to her all the improvement on the Land that I bought of William Dorringer and the youngest corner of age with timber to support the said land if found on the land but and if she or said wife does not keep the children together she shall be entitled to one third of the said improvement that I bought of the said William Dorringer. Then I give and bequeath to my beloved children an equal share of all my goods and chattels as they come of age except they stay together with their Mother namely Mary Robert, Agnes, John, David, George, Betty and Pica. And as for my wife now past with as they leave their Mother occasionally she shall be bound by my will and Testament she shall be bound to pay them their proportionable part of my said estate if of age or Mary

wife Jane is to keep in possession as long as she lives and then it is to be divided

stock and all the rest of the property belongs to Jane my wife as long as she lives
all the property that belongs to my wife Jane is to be divided after her death between

At a county court held for Nelson County on Monday 21st of November 1811
This last will and testament of Charles Matheson deceased was proved by the oaths
of William Redman and William Bray the subscribing witnesses thereto

and ordered to be recorded - and on the motion of Jane Matheson, administratrix of
the estate of the said deceased with her will annexed is granted her, whereupon she with
William Bray and Charles Matheson her securities entered into bond in the pen-
alty of one thousand dollars conditioned according to law and the oath of Jane

and it is my will that the said Elizabeth Collins and her heirs shall have and
enjoy any more of my estate that may in part of her portion than 2nd my
son Thomas W. Wm. I give & give to him some years ago one thousand
Acres of land out of the above entry of 36.236 Acres which said thousand Acres of land
I conveyed to Wm. Johnston for my said son he having directed me so to do that
is all and every part or parts of my estate I design for my son Thomas and his heirs
it being as much as I am able to give him after doing as well by the rest of my children
John Spore and bequeath to my children (to wit) Margaret Collins wife of Joseph
Lewis Hannah W. Roberts Wife of Lewis Roberts, James O. Wm. Maria J. Wm.
John W. Wm. and William L. Wm. all the rest of the said entry of 36.236
Acres which I have in the County of Greenup also all the Claim to all the
Land I have lying in Randolph County which I received from Thomas Wm.
my wife's father about the bonds notes or account I have against all per-
son or persons, likewise the legacy that was due from my father's Estate
to be equally divided amongst my said Children above named Elizabeth Collins
and Thomas W. Wm. are not contained in the last Bequest they having had
