E^c In the Name of God Amen I John Brice of the County of Nelson and State of Kentucky being weak in Body but of sound Mind and Memory calling to mind the mortality of my body & knowing that it is appointed for all men once to die therefore do make and revise this my last Will and Testament. In the first place it is my Will and desire that all my Just debts of every description shall be paid out of my Estate by my Executors herein afterwards to be named. I will and bequeath to my beloved Wife Abigail one third part of my estate during her Natural life in the nature of a dower. I will and bequeath the residue of my estate to my five Children (to wit) George, Patsy, John, Edward, and James, to be equally divided amongst them in the manner following (to wit) it being my wish and desire that my estate should be kept together and improved for the support of my a^d Wife and Children my Executors herein afterwards to be named are fully authorized empowered and directed to pay to each of my Children when they marry or arrive at the age of twenty one years their ratable proportion of my estate both real and personal, that part of my estate which is to be assigned to my a^d Wife during her life is at her decease also to be equally divided amongst my Children, my executors as a^d are hereby directed occasionally to sell such of the Estate stock or other personal property as may be worth spared for the support of my family this power they may exercise from time to time as circumstances may require or their own discretion direct, my Executors are by these presents particularly requested to pay every Attention to the education of my a^d Children and to do lawfully utterly disinterested and watch every other Will and Testament and do by these presents constitute and appoint my Dearest Son James Brice and Joseph Hodge Executors of this my last Will and Testament.
