To wit I give and bequeath to my loving wife Abigail all my lands and tenements all my household and kitchen furniture all my farming utensils all my stock of horses cows and hogs my two negro boys Harry and Ragie to be her proper right during

her natural life and after her death to be equally divided between my two sons Joseph and Ignatius Seivil and what is hereafter called them I give to my daughter Jane Haysden twenty shillings in good property to be paid by her mother. Item I give to my daughter Dorothy Laught seventy five dollars in good property after all my just debts be paid and settled. Item I give and bequeath to my five daughters Elizabeth Sary Mary Straby Ann eighty dollars each to be paid to them as they arrive to the age of eighteen years to be paid in good property at cash value and my stills to be sold and applied to such uses as my wife Abigail sees cause lastly I recommend and appoint Ignatius Haysden my sole executor of this my last will and testament in testimony whereof I have hereunto set my hand and affixed my seal this sevenieth day of February in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and fourteen signed and sealed by me Matthew Seivil as my last will and testament and in the presence of us the under written subscribers and we in the presence of them and in the presence of each other
