On the Motion of Richard Walker administrator of John Basy and
 Orders that Abraham King Joshua Hobbs & Nicholas Hay managers of the
 estate examine and settle the accounts of the said administrator and return
 the settlement to the next term of this court

In obedience to an order of the worshipful Court of Nelson County made at
 the December term 1814 we whose names are undersigned met and proceeded
 to the following settlement with Richard Walker administrator of John
 Basy and

First on examining the sale book we find the amount of sales to be \$4,200.00

Second on examining the amount of expenses according to the
 following vouchers (to wit)

Voucher No. 1	" 58 20	" 40	30 "
" 2	" 77 20	" 50	30 "
" 3	" 63 20	" 50	20 "
	" 20	" 10	" 50

We consider the administrator to be entitled
 for our services as commissioners \$5 each which we have received - 25.00

Total amount of expenses - 105.00

Which we subtract from the amount of sales and find the sum of \$4,095.00

The widows think after taking out expenses - 147.50

What remains to divide among the legatees is three being five leg-
 ates each one's part is - 29.50

The following will show what the administrator has paid the
 widows and each legatee

Voucher No. 8 what the widow of John Basy has received and that it is of 147.50

Voucher No. 9 108.50 11 shows what Elias Basy one of the
 legatees of John Basy has received on his own & his brother's part

Do Basy's are? Elias being guardian for John

The total amount received by Elias Basy - 253.50

Voucher No. 12 & 13 shows what Elijah Basy has received - 20.00

In the Name of God Amen I Elias Milton being in weak in body but in my
 perfect senses do make and ordain this my last will and testament first I recom-
 mend my soul to God that gave it and my body to its mother land as it con-
 spects my property personal and real I will and bequeath to my beloved
 wife Mary Milton all my land houses & negro fellow named Lewis together
 or with stock of every kind and every article of property I might during
 her natural life and her death I will and bequeath to my eldest son James
 Milton two dollars, my son Robert Milton two dollars it is to be un-
 derstood that after the death of my wife it is my will that my land shall
 be sold at publick sale and equally divided between the lot of my children
 namely Moses Milton, Richard Milton, Elijah Milton, Samuel Milton,
 John Milton, Pearly Milton, William Milton, Elizabeth Milton, Nancy Milton,
 Mariah Milton and one equal share to the heirs of Moses Wilson and Peggy
 Wilson his wife namely Francis Wilson John Wilson and Ann Wilson
 Edmund Wilson and it is also my will that my negro fellow named Lewis
 together with all the rest of the property of every kind shall be sold at
 publick sale and equally divided between Elijah Milton, James Milton,
 John Milton, Pearly Milton, William Milton, Elizabeth Milton,
 Nancy Milton, Mariah Milton, and one equal part to the heirs of Mo-
 ses Wilson's heirs of Pearly Milton and Peggy Wilson his wife also bequeath
 to Moses Wilson and Peggy Wilson his wife two dollars it is understood
 that by this will that James Milton, Robert Milton, Moses Wilson
 and Peggy his wife has two dollars each and that only and it is also
 my will that Elijah Milton and William Milton shall be executors to this
 will signed sealed and delivered in presence of us the subscribing
 witnesses this fourth day of November 1814
