County of Nicholas and state of Kentucky being in a
sickly & infirm state of body but of sound mind and
memory (helped by god) considering the uncertainty of life
and transitory nature of all worldly things do make and
Ordeal this my last Will and Testament in the manner
and form following to wit: And first that my body
be decently interred and I do commend my soul to God
who gave it. That my Executors hereafter named
shall make a true and just inventory of all my personal
estate except my wife's wardrobe and cloaths and the
grain now in the ground and the produce of the
late harvest with the floor and hay: the grain to be
and for the fulfilling of such contracts as I have made
to be paid in that kind of property and the rest to be
and for the support of my family:—To my wife
beloved wife Elizabeth. I do hereby give and bequeath
her jewels with all her wearing apparel and also one
third part of the personal property not yet named
