State of Kentucky, being sick and weak in Body
at the of some disposing mind and memory, thanks
be to God for his mercy, and calling to mind the
mortality of my Body and that it is appointed
for me when and to die do make and award this
my Last Will and Testament. That is to say,
Primarily and first of all I give and bequeath
my Soul to the almighty God who gave it, and
my Body to be Buried in a Christian like manner,
at the discretion of my friends, and as touching
such worldly Estates in Pleasure God to bless me

with in this life, I give and devise and dispose of in
the following manner and form — I give and bequeath
unto my Brother Samiah Capaway all my Part
of the Plantation that we now live on also all
my Personal Estate after Paying my Just Debts
and Paying and his Daughter Polly half way Twelve
Dollars, I also bequeath bequeath unto an ad-
point my Brother Samiah Capaway to be my Sole
Executor of this my Last Will and Testament.
I do hereby annul and revoke all and every other
Will and bequests and Executors by me or any way named
or Bequeathed, confirming this and no other to be my
Last Will and Testament in writing, Whereof I have
hitherto set my hand and seal, this day and date
above written — Signed sealed and delivered by the
said Thomas Capaway as his Last Will and Testament
in the Presence of us who in his Presence and in the
Presence of each other have hitherto signed our names —

An Instrument of Writing purporting to be the
Last Will and Testament in writing of Thomas
Capaway Deceased was produced into open Court
and proven by the oath of Thomas Davison
and ordered to be filed, and at the November
Court was proven by the oath of William Reasing
a subscribing Witness thereto, and ordered to be
Recorded, And as Motion of Samiah Capaway
the Executor therein named, who made oath thereto
and together with William Reasing and Henry
Potts entered into and acknowledged their Bond
in the Penalty of \$300 conditioned as aing to
Law — and thereupon Certificate is given a thing
for obtaining a Probate thereof in due form —
