 at the house of Hamblin F. Stokes Deceased
 the County of Nicholas on the first day of Febru-
 ary 1814 and that the said Hamblin F. Stokes was
 then lying sick but in his perfect mind & mem-
 ory & fully capable of disposing of his proper-
 ty agreeable to Law and we the aforesaid Hall &
 Irwin was present when the said Stokes made the
 following noncupative Will of his property to wit
 I Give I bequeath unto my black Wife
 Phebeah min Stokes three Negroes (Bry) Letty
 & two Negro Boys named Asy & Phill to her
 & her heirs forever also I bequeath unto my said
 Wife all my property of every Species on Ven-
 ermination Both Real & personal I hold myself
 have or Claim in the State of Kentucky During
 her life at her Decease the property to descend
 my Daughter Pamela Jane Stokes & her Heirs
 forever Item my my Estate that I have in Ex-
 pectation of from my mother in the State of Virginia
 If said estate should be realized I give the same
 to my Daughter Pamela Stokes & her heirs forever
 Item what Depts I owe I direct that Peter
 my Negro man & two horses be sold to pay said De-
 bts & we the said Hall & Irwin do further State that
 the aforesaid Stokes did make this will the afo-
 re said in his last sickness and but a few hours before
 his Death in our presence as Witnesses & for
 that purpose Given under our hands & Seals
 this first day of February 1814
