Last Will and Testament hereby Revoking and an-
nulling all others heretofore made, In the first place
I recommend my Soul to the Almighty God the Creator
of it and my Body I leave to the discretion of my
Executors to be buried in a decent manner, Secondly I
direct that all my Just Debts be paid out of my Estate
Thirdly I bequeath unto my loving wife Prabe-
cca Drummond one Third Part of all my Estate
be the Real & Personal which I possess or have
a Right title or Claim to during her Widow-
hood & at her decease should she die unmarried then
she may dispose of it as she thinks proper Fourth-
ly I give & bequeath unto my daughter Eleanor
one good Cow & calf & a good feather Bed & Saddle
the residue of my Real & personal Estate I give
unto my sons John James & David forever to be equ-
ly divided between them as joint tenants in common; my
three Married Daughters Polly Wilson Elizabeth
Godman & Rachel Batson having portioned & set-
tled my property upon them as well as my Execu-
tors would admit in their Courts reasonable expe-
I do not leave them any thing I now to conclude
I appoint Messieurs Samuel Griffith & my wife
Prabecca Drummond my Executors to prove & Execute
this Will to the Intent Intent & meaning
thereof In testimony whereof I have hereunto set my
hand

Samuel Griffith who made oath thereto & to-
gether with James Wilson & John Batson who entered
into Bond in the penalty of \$1000 Current money
Conditions according to Law and orders to be Recorded —
and thereupon Certificate is Granted her for obtaining
A probate thereof in due form —
