First of all to my beloved wife, I bequeath all my property during her life, or her widowhood, only my son John he is to have the half of the clear land, and he may clear more if he sees cause. he is to work and take care of the family, and to have the slaves to help him to work, and if he should chose to build an house let him build where it will best suit him and the land, and at the death of my property to be equally divided among my five children, and if any of them should die without

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without Mine (Wife) while two are minors, their part to be equally divided among the others four. further my little son James he must have taught the five common Rules, and the Rules of three perfectly, and to read well in the bible, and to write a legible hand. further if my widow and my son John should see an advantage in selling the land, they have full power so to do, so that the pay may be reserved carefully for the heirs. I constitute my Wife and my son John my Executors, and my son John Guardians for my children, this I declare to be recorded as my last will and Testament. Seventh. I do hereby appoint Alexander Blair and William Thompson to execute this my last will and Testament. hereby revoking all former wills by me made. All and singularly my lands and mesuages and tenements by them freely to be disposed and enjoyed: and I do hereby utterly disavow, revoke and disannul all every other former Testament, wills, legacies bequests Executors by me and in anywise before mentioned, willed and bequeathed, and ratifying and confirming this and no others to be my last will and Testament.
