In the name of Almighty God Amen I James Gray of the County of Nicholas and State of Kentucky being convinced of the frailty of Life and knowing it to be appointed for all men once to die and though being weak in body, yet of sound and perfect understanding do make this my last Will and Testament (Wit) In the first place I give my Body to the Earth from whence it was taken, in hopes of his resurrection at the last day, to be interred in a decent and Christian like manner; As to my real estate I will and positively order that all my just Debts be paid - then I give and bequeath to my beloved wife Hannah Gray, all and singular my possessions and property to be vested in her for the purpose of raising and educating my Children and the same to be vested in her during her life widowhood But if through the ~~time~~ ^{the} progress of the time of raising my Children she should again dispose to marry then in that case she is to receive of my Estate what the Law in such cases allows, and the same to be applied as above stated - It is also my will that my said wife Hannah Gray together with Ebenezer Blane have the power to carry this my last will into effect and I do hereby Com^{it} unto them executors of this my last will and Testament
