of the County of Nicholas and State of Kentucky
being of sound mind and memory and considering
the uncertainty of this mortal life and for the same
reason, do make Constitute and publish this My Last
Will and Testament, in manner and form fol-
lowing first, I recommend, my body to be buried
in a decent and Christian like Manner, and as
to my worldly affairs, that it has pleased God
to bestow upon me in this life, I give and dispose
of, in the following manner, In the first place it
is my wish and I do order that my Executors
herein after mentioned do pay all my last
Debts, and funeral Charges, In the first place
my own which I have here bequeathed 33. Shillings and 6 pence
I do give unto Zephaniah Prater, and my mare
and cow and one Rifle gun and all my Cooper
Tools, In the next place it is my will and desire
that Thomas Rucker Prater shall have five
Dollars It is also my will and desire that
Reuben Prater, shall have three Dollars, It is
also my wish and desire, that Negroe Lundy
shall be free on the day of my Death, And
further it is my wish and desire, that Negroe
Dimes shall serve six years, after the day of
my Death Negroe Bob to serve six years
after the day of my Death, and Negroe Tom,
to serve three years after my Death It
is also my will and desire that the Balance of my
Property both real and personal be divided
Equally between Jeremiah Prater Zephaniah
Prater, Ashford Prater & Patsy Colton and further
It is my will and desire that if the above named
Negroes cannot be freed under the Law of this State
they shall be sold for cash after the death of my

my beloved wife and the many divided equally
between Jeremiah Butler, Josephine Butler and
Solomon Butler, & Peter Collins and Lastly I do
here appoint and assign, Jeremiah Butler and
Josephine Butler my sole Executors of this my
Last Will and Testament, hereby Resolving all
former Wills, by me made In Witness
Whereof I have hereunto set my hand

To have and to hold as long as she lives and
after her death my will and desire is that
the whole of my Estate, real & personal
should be sold, and equally divided among
my (children) Lastly I do nominate & appoint
my wife Ruth Wells my whole Execu-
trix of this my Last Will & Testament,
resolving all others In Testimony whereof I
have hereunto set my hand & seal this 6th
day of September one thousand eight
hundred & eleven Aaron Wells (L.S.)
