Estate contained in the Articles of agreement between
myself and Eliza Barlow, during her lifetime and then
for it to go to the said Eliza Barlow
Then Give to my well beloved Son William Barlow
and Daughter Elizabeth Gammels and Gammels
Mary Epifon Eastle Fing and Lemmy Sadler the
Money arising from the sale of a certain tract of Land
containing forty acres now sold to my son William
Barlow and from the sale of two Horse Carriages
one a road mare and the other a Black mare except
so much as will leave one Dollar to my son John Barlow
and one Dollar to my son Franky Barlow and one
Dollar to my son Jesse Barlow and one Dollar to
my daughter Emily Barlow which I give and bequeath
to each of them - And I do hereby appoint William
Barlow and Jesse Baskett Executors to this my last
will and Testament in writing whereof I have subscribed
set my hand and affixed my seal this tenth day
of September in the year of our Lord Eighteen hundred
and Eight
