In the name of God, Amen: the 1st March 1802. I John Jones being weak in body but of a sound understanding thanks be to almighty God for his mercies, do make constitute, ordain and declare this to be my last will and Testament in manner and form following. First, I will, that all my reasonable debts be paid. Secondly I

have to my wife Sarah Jones during her natural life one man named Jacob thirdly, I leave to my son John Jones two pounds out of an Execution Jones surety for him for fourthly, I give to my son James Jones two hundred acres of land where he now lives to him and his heirs forever. Fifthly, I give unto my Daughter Elizabeth Elam one bond I have in my hand against Francis Elam to her and her heirs forever. Sixthly, I give unto my son David Jones Ten pounds to be paid out of a bond due me. Seventhly, I give unto my son Moses Jones the land whereon I now live. The rest of my estate I leave to Nancy Williams & Moses Jones to them and their heirs forever to be equally divided. I leave Moses Jones and Hubbard Williams Executors of this my last will and Testament.
