

The Cornelius Hall & Samuel Irwin was present
 at the house of Hamblin F. Stokes Deceased
 the County of Nicholas on the first day of Febru-
 ary 1814 and that the said Hamblin F. Stokes was
 then lying sick but in his perfect mind & mem-
 ory & fully capable of disposing of his proper-
 ty agreeable to Law and we the aforesaid Hall &
 Irwin was present when the said Stokes made the
 following noncupative Will of his property to wit
 I Give I bequeath unto my black Wife
 Picturah min Stokes three Negroes (Bry) Letty
 & two Negro Boys named Asy & Phill to her
 & her heirs forever also I bequeath unto my said
 Wife all my property of every Species on Ven-
 ermination Both Real & personal I hold myself
 have or Claim in the State of Kentucky During
 her life at her Decease the property to descend
 my Daughter Pamela Jane Stokes & her Heirs
 forever Item my my Estate that I have in Ex-
 pectation of from my mother in the State of Virginia
 If said estate should be realized I give the same
 to my Daughter Pamela Stokes & her heirs forever
 Item what Debts I owe I direct that Peter
 my Negro man & two horses be sold to pay said Debts
 & me the said Hall & Irwin do further State that
 the aforesaid Stokes did make this will the afo-
 re said in his last sickness and but a few hours before
 his Death in our presence as Witnesses & for
 that purpose Given under our hands & Seals
 this first day of February 1814

 Conditioned as the Law directs & Granted that Cer-
 tificate Issue &c. The noncupative will of said
 Stokes being proven by Cornelius Hall & Samuel
 Irwin & that Franklin Collier William Holla-
 day William M Dorrell & Ipham Johnson do
 appraise said Estate and ordered it be Recorded
 &c. &c.

 being weak in Body but of perfect mind & mem-
 ory do hereby make this my last will and Testament
 in the manner & form following (to wit) First
 my will & desire is that so much of my personal
 property be sold as will be sufficiently to pay all
 my just Debts; Second my will and desire is that my
 beloved wife Lucy Sadder retain the Ballance of
 my Estate both Real & personal in her possession
 in order to raise my Children untill such time as
 they may come of age then for her to take her third
 for life the ballance to be sold & equally Divided as-
 mongst my several Children

Third my will & desire is in case my wife Lucy Sadder
 shall many before my Children become of age
 then for her to take her third the Ballance of my
 Land to be rented out for the use & benefit of my Chil-
 dren untill they should become of age

Fourth I do hereby appoint my beloved wife
Lucy Sadler Executor of this my last will and
Testament. In Witness whereof I have hereunto set
my hand and seal this 16th day of November in the
Year of our Lord One Thousand Eight Hundred and
Thirteen

Nicholas County for May Court 1814

An Instrument of Writing purporting to be
the last will & Testament of John Sadler Deceased
was produced in open Court & proven by the Oaths
of Jesse Bashette & Thomas Dupree & ordered
to be Recorded — and on motion of Lucy Sadler
the Executor therein named who made oath to the truth
and together with Thomas Dupree her Security
who entered into Bond in the penalty of \$1000 Cur-
rent money conditioned according to Law and order
that Certificate Issue &c and that John Chaney
William Johnson Sabin Johnson & John George
gan or any three of them do approve said Estate

In the name of God Amen, I Mills Harney
of Nicholas County and ^{Commonwealth of Kentucky}
knowing it appointed for all men once to die
and now being weak in body but of perfect mind
and memory do make this my last will & Testa-
ment and do first recommend my Soul to God who
gave it and as to Real & personal property that

God has blessed me with I do dispose of the same
in the following manner to wit

First I Give & Bequeath to my blood wife
Nancy Exclusive of her thirds the plantation
and benefits arising there from and Lands adjacent
thereto for & during her ^{own} natural life time
and she is to take care of four youngest Chil-
dren — 2nd I Give & Bequeath to Roland Har-
ney, Hiram Harney, Rhoda Harney, Thomas
Harney, & Hannah Harney, & Emily Harney
Samuel Harney, & Selby Harney, & Mills
Harney, & Catty Harney, one Common Bible to
be raised out of my Estate — and the Death of
my wife — 3rd and after my Just Debts is paid &
the Death of my wife an Equal Division is
to take place of all my real & personal Estate
among my four youngest Children first being
God to the best advantage — 4th and my wife
Nancy is to have and keep in possession all my house
hold ^{and} furniture & stock of every kind with the
House hold furniture plantation utensils &
all my personal property during her ^{natural} life and
lastly I do appoint Nancy Harney my wife
& William Powell Executors of this my last will
& Testament revoking all others given under my
and seal this 9th day of March 1814
