that it is appointed for all men once to die
do make and ordain this my last Will and
testament, that is to say principally and first of all
I give and recommend my soul into the hands
of almighty god that gave it, and my body I
recommend to the earth to be buried in decent
Christian burial at the discretion of my Executors
Nothing doubting but at the general resurrection
I shall receive the same again by the mighty
power of god, and in trusting such worldly estate
wherewith it hath pleased god to bless me in
this life, I give devise and dispose of the
same in following manner and form. - First
I give devise and bequeath unto my wife Helen
Wife Mary, all my household and kitchen furniture
together with a horse and pillion and the choice
of three milch cows and growing estate; when my
Debt debts are all paid, then I give to my wife
Helen son Thomas one third of my whole estate
both real and personal, I give to my wife Helen
Daughter Mary one third of my whole estate
both real and personal I give to my wife

13 Helen Daughter Lucy one third of my whole
estate both real and personal, again I give to
my wife Helen son Jeph one shilling, I give to
my wife Helen son Joseph one shilling I
give to my wife Helen son William one shilling
I give to my wife Helen son John one shilling
I give to my wife Helen son James twenty dollars
in part pay of a horse I give to my wife
Helen Daughter Elizabeth one shilling I give to
my wife Helen Daughter Liddy one shilling
Lastly I bind my Executors and Administrators to pay
my grand Daughter Elizabeth Stewart Daughter
of Robert Stewart Decreed Seventy five dollars
together with the Interest thereof. A.B. The legacies
is all to be paid off out of the estate save the
three young ones which is to receive their equal part
off both real and personal off what remains when
the real is all discharged to wit. Thomas Mary and
Lucy Stewart is to run equal portions in the
remainder, I likewise constitute make and ordain
Jeph Bastell E.S. and William Baker the
sole Executors of this my last will and testament
and as hereby utterly disallow and annul all
and every other former testament, Wills legacies
bequests and Executors by me in any wise named
written or bequeathed, Ratifying and confirming

they are here to say that and
testament, in witness whereof I have set at
my hand and seal this thirty first day of
December in the year of our Lord one thousand
eight hundred and four.
