In the name of God, Amen: I, William Reed of the County of Nicholas and State of Kentucky, being weak of body, but of sound mind and memory thanks be given to God, calling to mind the mutability of my body, do hereby make and ordain this my last will and Testament, that is to say, principally I recommend my soul to God who gives it, and my body to be decently interred at the discretion of my Executors, and as touching my worldly estate, I give devise and dispose of it in the following manner and form to wit. First I give and bequeath to my son George and William the lands on which I now live to be equally divided between them, also to George his saddle and a bay horse called pinner, also to William the cot that my man now has, and to my daughter Martha and Nancy all my household furniture not before mentioned with their wheelbarrow and to Martha her saddle and a bay horse (called Liberty) and to Nancy my mare above mentioned with her saddle and harness and calf, and one cow and calf to George

and William, and one cow and calf to Nancy. And all the rest of my property after my Debts is paid to be divided equally amongst my children above named to wit, George, William, Martha and Nancy, except the sum of hereinafter specified, that is to say, to my son in law Matthew McFarland the sum of five shillings sterling, to my son in law George Workman the sum of five shillings sterling, and to son John Beas the sum of five shillings sterling.

Also I do hereby constitute make and ordain George Beas and Cornelius Hall exequit. Executors of this my last will and Testament, which I do hereby declare to be my last will and Testament. In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this fourth day of May, in the year of our lords one thousand Eight hundred and one.
