 in body but of a sound Mind and Memory,
 knowing that God hath appointed me for
 all this to die, and after Death judgment
 will make constitute and ordain this my last
 Will and Testament, revoking all others
 heretofore made, in my Name, after recom-
 mending my soul to God that giveth and
 my body to my friends to be buried
 in a Christian like manner, and as touching
 those worldly things which I have pleasure
 in, to keep me with, I wish to dispose of them
 in the following manner, to wit, first that all
 my just debts be paid, I then leave to
 my beloved wife all my plantation except
 the part my son John now occupies, during
 her lifetime, and at her death to be divided
 between John & James Baker agreeable to an
 article that now exists, also I leave to my
 beloved wife all my Negroes, and all
 house hold furniture, and all my stock
 of every kind and farming utensils during
 her natural life, and at her death my
 Negroes and all other property be equally
 divided amongst all my children, my Will
 that I give and Give my two old Negroes
 be set at Liberty at my Wifes death and
 my Executors keep them from suffering
 Harsh.

102 I then leave to my Grand son Martin McClure
 One hundred Dollars and a fifty Dollar horse and
 a saddle to be paid by my Executors After
 he comes of age, My Will that my after
 named Executors be fully authorized to settle
 all my business, and make all divisions
 agreeable to this Will, and that they make

shall be free at the day of my Death, And
further It is my wish and desire, that Negroe
Diner shall serve six years, after the day of
my Death Negroe Bob to serve two years
after the day of my Death, and Negroe Sam,
to serve three years after my Death It
is also my will and desire that the Balance of my
property both real and personal be divided
Equally between Jeremiah Prater Zephaniah
Prater, Ashford Prater & Patsy Cotton and further
It is my will and desire that if the above named
Negroes cannot be freed under the Law, that they
they shall be sold for cash after the death of my
