have her part, and the rest of my children have equal part after my daughter getting the Cloths and chist left from her mother and to have her part with the two boys John and David. And my wife to take the loom and chist above, off my incumbrance. The rest of the property to be appraised and sold. and the Childrens money to be put on interest till of age. And my Cloths to be divided with my two sons. my big Bible to my son John Phillips. And that David Hopkins & George Bulph settle my business, and so to leave my soul to Christ Jesus My. - This to be my last will and Testament.
