 Secondly I give and devise to my three Children
 all my real and personal property to be equally di-
 vided among them their names as followeth
 Betty Dallas Samuel Harris Sarah Barton
 Betty Dallas to have the plantation I now live
 on at its valuation his life time and at her death
 all her part to descend to her Daughter Sarah and at
 Sarah Barton death all her part to descend to her son
 Samuel Harris Barton as for my Black Woman
 named Betty her son Abraham is to have his pay
 paying one hundred and thirty Dollars this to take
 place at Christmas. Thirdly & lastly I do order
 and appoint my two sons in law Elijah Barton
 & William Dallas Executors to this my last Will &
 Testament.
