 security entered into and acknowledged bond in the
 penalty of \$1000 Conditioned according to Law who
 is Ordered to be Recorded — And thereupon Certificate
 is Granted her for obtaining Appropriate Proof in due
 form

In the name of God Amen I Samuel Pinkast
 of Nicholas County and State of Kentucky being in
 a low state of health and sick in body yet in perfect
 mind and memory thanks be to God for all his mercies
 to me but calling to mind the mortality of my
 body and knowing that it is appointed for all men
 once to die; I do make and Ordain this to be my last
 will and Testament that is to say first of all I do
 recommend my soul to God who give it and my
 body to the ~~Ground~~ Earth from whence it came &
 to be Buried in a decent manner in hopes it shall be
 Restored at the Resurrection; And as touching such now-
 day effects as it hath pleased God to bless me with in
 this life I do give and bequeath as follows to wit;
 First of all my lawful debts to be fully Discharged
