In the name of God Amen I Hugh Stitt of the County of Nicholas and Commonwealth of Kentucky being of sound mind and memory but recalling the mortality of my body do make and ordain this to be my last will and Testament in manner and form to wit
 I do give and devise to my beloved wife Mary Stitt the one third part of my land to include all the buildings and to have as much timber as will keep the same in good repair, and as much fuel as she will stand in need of for her own use so long as she lives. Also I do give and devise to her my Gray horse that I raised my two bay mares and one bay colt all my cattle sheep hogs hives hives and chickens, turkeys and all my plantation utensils of every description also the one half of the current crop of grain of every description, I do give and devise to my son James Stitt his heirs forever besides that I have given him the one fourth part of all the property that my wife Mary died in possession of except the land. I do give and devise to my daughter Rachel Stitt formerly Rachel Stitt and her heirs forever besides what I have given her the one fourth part of all the property that my wife Mary died in possession of except the land. I do give and devise to my daughter Mary Stitt formerly Mary Stitt and her heirs forever sixty dollars as soon as it can be recovered of debt and things and also the one fourth part of all the property that my wife Mary died in possession of except the land. I do give and devise to my son Samuel Stitt and his heirs forever besides what I have given him the one third of my land the one half of the wages and feed and the one fourth part of my current crop, also at the death of my wife the one half of her third of the land. I do give and devise to my son John and his heirs forever the Gray horse I bought of Ephraim Tigg. The one third part of my land, the half of the wages and feed, and the one fourth part of my present crop, also at the death of my wife the one half of

her third of the land. It is my wish and desire at my wife's death that the one hundred and ten acres of land should be equally divided between my son Samuel and John. I now resign my soul to God who gave it to me and lastly I nominate my son James Stitt to be my Executor for this my last Will and Testament, hereby revoking all former wills by me made. Testimony thereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this 25th day of September 1829.
