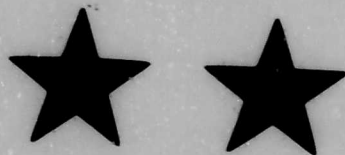

As it remembrance that this is my Last Will and
 Testament, that after death my body to be buried decently and
 my soul to God who gave it, and that after all just debts is
 paid, and my estate the balance of the estate divided equally
 in this way (viz) The Land at my death shall belong to my son
 George Thaw except his mother share which for must split
 with the house which he doath, which twice then be George
 Thaw's and the wife also hold her share of my property until
 her death, which she may dispose of as she please. George Thaw
 in consequence of getting the Land all to pay his three children money
 being

John Thaw's
 Will
 In the name of God Amen: I John Archer of the County of
 Nicholas and State of Kentucky, being in a firm state of health and
 being weak in body but of a sound memory (I give and bequeath
 my money to her) and calling to mind the mortality of my body know-
 ing that it appointed for all men to die, I do this seventh
 day of October in the year of our Lord one thousand eight
 hundred and fifty four Ordain that to my last Will and Tes-
 tament, that is to say, first and principally I give and bequeath
 my soul to God who gave it, and my body to the dust to be bur-
 ied in a decent and Christian manner, nothing doubting but at
 the general resurrection I shall receive the same again by the
 power of almighty God. And in touching such worldly estate
 as I do possess of I will and dispose of in the following man-
 ner. First it is my Will that all my last Will and Testament ex-
 cept to pay one of the money to my son John Archer and the balance
 of that should not be enough, the money coming to my son John
 Archer Decedent and him for service done and the balance
 shall be taken to discharge them. Secondly I will and be-
 queath that my beloved wife Elizabeth shall have the land and
 kitchen (the Men Live in with the house of the dear Lord
 belonging to the plantation, during her life for her support
 and that she may live for her and her daughter (Elizabeth) all
 the better she be at her disposal as she may think fit and two
 cows Mary and white cow and calf, and head clothing and bed
 stead, the cupboard at her disposal and two large kettles, and
 two bako ovens, three chairs, one pair of long and short with in
 the spinning wheel and a bed and all the things, one set of
 my clothes to be with her life free.

Thirdly I do will to my Daughter Rebecca Hamilton one
 Dollar. Fourthly I will to my Daughter Mary Moore one
 Dollar. And fifthly I will to my Daughter Nancy Thaw one
 Dollar. And sixthly I will to my Daughter Sarah Thaw one
 Dollar. And seventhly I will to my Daughter Elizabeth Thaw one
 Dollar. And eighthly I will to my son James Archer the
 balance of the land and house and land, also the house of 8 1/2 acres
 of Land among friends. I give and bequeath to my daughter
 by my father James Archer, if it is yet, also all the farming in-
 struments belonging to the place or belonging to me, I leave to her
