Will of Peter Shulze

Be it remembered that I Peter Shulze of the County of Nicholas and State of Kentucky, knowing that all mankind has once to die, and being at this time much indisposed, and feeling a desire to leave my worldly affairs as much settled as possible, proceed and make the following disposition of my estate which is my last will and testament, revoking all former ones: it being in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and twenty nine, on the 14th day of June.
 Item 1st having special regard to my wife Elizabeth I do and bequeath to her the one third of all my estate, or the proceeds of my estate after all debts is paid. Item 2nd I do ordain and appoint my son John to be my Executor to transact and settle all my business. I further authorize him to sell the plantations where I now live on, and make or direct or conveyance to the purchaser. Item 3rd The crops now raising on the plantations I want applied to the benefit and use of my wife and family. Item 4th After all debts against me are paid, and then the one third of the remaining balance is to be paid over to my wife Elizabeth as is mentioned in Item first, the balance then remaining to be equally divided between all my children as follows - all my children which is married I want them charged with the following sums, Keen Shulze three hundred and forty two Dollars, Abraham Shulze one hundred twenty two Dollars, Mark Shulze one hundred twenty two Dollars, Susan my daughter one hundred forty two Dollars, my daughter Polly Hoffman one hundred forty two Dollars, my daughter Barbara Hoffman one hundred forty two Dollars, my son John one hundred forty two Dollars, my daughter Catherine one hundred forty two Dollars. The balance of my children which has not received any thing - my Executor will pay them the over and sums to make them equal with the aforesaid married children, if they should be that much remaining, if there should be any thing over I want the balance equally divided between all my children. Item 5th My son George has a mare which he claims and one man's saddle which I will and bequeath to him allowing my Executor to charge him fifty Dollars for the same to be a part of his legacy. Item 6th My Executor will pay to Jackson Ackerman, my grand son one horse valued at \$50 one saddle at \$25 and his schooling when he comes of age, or to his guardian; and if he is with the family when he comes of age, my Executor will give him a suit of clothes.
