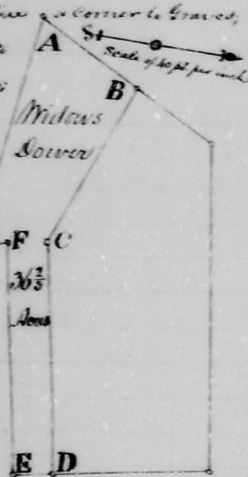

In pursuance of an order of the Nicholas County Court to us directed, We the undersigned, Commissioners, met at the house of the late Hugh Stitt, deceased, on the 16th day of August 1832, and being duly sworn, proceeded to lay off and

applied unto Mary Stitt, widow and relict of Hugh Stitt, Dec'd, her Dower in the lands of which the said Hugh Stitt, died seized and possessed, situate in this County; Pursuant to the will of said Deceased. The boundary of said Dower lot is as followeth, to-wit:
