heirs and assigns forever. 3^d My will and desire is that at my death my wife shall keep so much of my stock such as horses cattle hogs sheep &c. as she may think necessary for her to keep and any she may see proper to sell she may sell and dispose of the proceeds of the sale as she may see proper the household and kitchen furniture I will unto my wife during her life.

It is my will that at the death of my wife all my personal estate that may fall to her and remains on hands shall be sold as the money arising from said sale shall be equally divided amongst all my children that are then living provided that those of my children that may be dead at the death of my wife and shall have children remaining alive then their children shall be entitled to the part their parents would have been entitled to in case they had been living.

In the name of God Amen! I Nancy H. Jeffries being weak in body but in soundness of my mind. Being 60th for the same I do make this my last will & testament to revoke and set aside all former wills first I will and bequeath that after death that my body shall be decently buried and laid in ground secondly that all my just debts shall be paid thirdly that my son Joseph has been doing business for me and that all the obligations now standing against him whether due or not due is to be considered as my debts and to be paid out of my estate fourthly that my son Joseph Jeffries is to be my executor and if he chooses may have the property of my estate by paying me my debts as above named and pay to my daughter Mary Hornback ninety six dollars in good property and to my son Miles Jeffries one hundred and eighty four dollars allowing him

to be paid at my death to be paid in such property as may suit a young man and pay to my son John Jeffries one hundred and eighty four dollars in good property when he becomes nineteen years of age allowing him to remain with Joseph and under his control until he arrives at the 20th nineteen years old Joseph is to give him sufficient schooling to do common business and comfortably clothe him suitable to the seasons and he is to be paid at nineteen given under my hand this thirtieth day of September in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and thirty three in the presence of John Hamilton, William Johnson, Nancy H.
