 Nicholas County, the undersigned Desjard Edwards, would respectfully
 report, that on the records of your County, there is an Article of
 agreement, bearing date the 28th April 1831. Entered into
 between Daniel Royce, Solomon Royce, William Royce, James
 Johnson, Leitus Royce, Little Robinson, and John Royce, heirs of
 Brian Royce dec'd. binding themselves to pay to the use of George
 & Royce & Co. three hundred & fifty dollars & fifty cents, of money & specific
 property, out of the estate of Brian Royce dec'd. appointing said Edwards to
 receive and disburse the money for to the use of said George & Co. (and
 for a further illustration see Article) said Edwards put to the use of said
 George & Co. specific property to the amount of one hundred & thirty
 dollars, and fifty cents, purchased at the sale of the personal estate of Brian
 Royce dec'd. One hundred & two dollars, eighty three cents - Entered one hundred
 and twenty acres of land in Shelby County, State of Illinois, being one hundred
