New and amended of an agreement and final settlement between the heirs & executors of John Rogers decd. It is agreed by the said Mary Rogers that she will take as her portion of said estate, a life estate in one third of the negroes now in her possession (excepting John Rogers) and one third of the personal estate she owns and has in her possession the said personal property to be hers absolutely. The said John Rogers decd. as his own, and all parties agree that he shall have, one bay horse 3 years old, one bay horse four years old, one grey mare four years old, one grey mare two years old, one brown mare two years old, two red cows two yearling calves, 20 head of pigs. The balance of his property as well as any other personal property now in the possession of Mrs. Mary Rogers, is to be equally divided between the heirs of said John Rogers decd. And all the said heirs having received fully nearly an equal portion of what estate has already been advanced to them, except John, who is entitled to more than the rest by the will of his father, they all agree that as to what has been so advanced, they are perfectly satisfied to let it remain so. & they further agree that the division of the lands of said decedent, heretofore made between them, shall stand as good and never be disturbed. This agreement is made to settle all differences, in relation to the estate of said decedent, and in relation to the last will & testament of said John Rogers decd. It is expressly understood that this agreement is not to affect the reversionary interest of said heirs in the share of said Mary in the slaves and real estate but the same is to descend at her death according to law. In testimony whereof we have hereunto set our hands and seals this 18th.
