Whereas on a Division of the slaves of John Johnson, Dec'd. by the Court, appointing the Nicholas County Court, amongst the heirs of said Dec'd. Twenty-two fortieths of a Negro woman named Matilda was allotted to Nicholas Johnson, and the remaining thirteen fortieths of the value of said Negro, was allotted to Elvira Jane Johnson, which Negro, has since had the following children, Sarah, about 8 years of age, Fanny about 8 years old, the 3^d a boy named Lewis about 18 months old. And whereas the Nicholas Johnson for himself, and John Miller, as the Guardians for said Elvira Jane Johnson (she still being an infant) have agreed to make a division of said Negroes, as follows, to wit, the said Nicholas Johnson to have the woman Matilda, and her children Sarah & Lewis, and the said Elvira Jane Johnson, to have the child Fanny, and the said Matilda pay to the Guardians of said Elvira Jane, one hundred dollars, in money now paid to said Guardians. In Witness whereof, We the said Nicholas Johnson, and John Miller, as Guardians for said Elvira Jane Johnson, have hereunto set our hands and seals this 22^d day of August, 1833.
