do make and publish, this Writing, as my Last Will and Testament
in manner and form following: To-wit:

Then, I give and bequeath to my beloved wife Zipporah, all her wearing apparel, her Bedstead, Bed and bedding, one low such as she may choose, her spinning wheel, my loom, as also all my house hold and kitchen furniture (except such articles as I have given unto my daughter Zipporah's son after mentioned, and also such articles which I have given unto the children of my son David Foster and his wife Priscilla his wife after named).

I then, I give and bequeath unto my Daughter Margaret Lincoln, the sum of five dollars to be paid by my Executors hereinafter named.

Here, I give and bequeath unto the children of my son David
 Foster and Priscilla his ^{wife} Mat. Samuel M. Foster, James L. Foster,
 Asaberry M. Foster, David G. Foster, and to such other children
 as my said son David, and Priscilla his wife may hereafter
 have, One hundred Twelve and one half Acres of land,
 on which my son David, and myself now lives, being
 the West end of my tract of land, which is bounded on the
 East by a line run by John Menefee when dividing my tract
 of land. My wagon and team, all my farming utensils,

Mills, and of every kind, all my horned cattle (except two cows, one of which I have given to my wife Zipporah, and the other to my daughter Effie.) All my stock of hogs, all also all the house hold and kitchen furniture which I have, ^{but} to my said son David Foster and Priscilla his wife, and which are in their possession at this time; and it is my will and desire that my said son David Foster and Priscilla his wife may keep the possession of and enjoy all the profits of the said tract of land now devised to their children as as full and ample a manner as tho they held it in their own right, during their natural lives; and at their death to be divided between their children. And it is also my will, that for easier consideration of the possession and enjoyment of the profits arising from the said tract of land and plantation thereof unto my said son David and his wife his heirs Executors and Administrators shall permit my said wife Zipporah to remain in and occupy the house I now live in, as long as she may live; and after my death, to furnish her at the said house a sufficient quantity of good fire wood to be cut and split, so as to be convenient to be put in the fire places, as long as she may live. And also to graze in the summer and feed ^{in the winter} the cow which cow which I have given to my said wife, And it is also my will after my death, that my son David Foster his heirs Executors or Administrators shall pay unto my said wife Zipporah, the sum of Twenty dollars yearly and every as long as my said wife may live: after my death.

then I give and bequeath unto my son James Foster Lusk one hundred and twelve and a half acres of land on which he now lives, which is bounded on the west by a line run by John Manser in dividing my tract of land: —

Item I give and bequeath unto my daughter Zipporah,
my two headsteebs, my two beads and a beading, which are common-
ly called her beads and beading, my Desk, my Black mare
called Star, my Cow called Peg, my lot of ground lying in the
Town of Barbours known by its number (Sixty) on the plat or
plan of said Town, It is my Will that she may have six of
my sheep, such as she may choose, and it is my Will and desire
that my Executors pay over to my said Daughter Zipporah, all the
Money that is owing to me by the heirs of Jacob Hams Decd. and
also all the money that is coming and owing to me by John Ham for
the land I bought of said Jacob Decd. which land was lost.
