I, H. Maynard in the Name of God Amen I James H. Maynard being very sick
 Will and weak of body but of sound mind and disposing Memory and calling to mind the uncertainty of life and knowing it is appointed for all men once to die do make and publish this my last Will and Testament. First I bequeath my soul to God who gave it and my body to the earth from whence it came to be buried in a Christian like manner and as it respects that portion of worldly estate with which it has pleased God to bless me I will and bequeath as follows. First I will that my personal estate be all sold and as it is in partnership with my brother Zelek Maynard and myself equally and as I do hereby constitute to have my executor my will is that he sell the same either privately or publicly as he may think best and the money arising therefrom to go to the payment of my debts. 2^d I will and bequeath unto my brother Zelek all my interest in the harmony land and as I have paid him one equal half of what he paid for the Harmony land which by a verbal contract between him and me was to entitle me to half said land. Now my will is that he is to hold the land and not to account for what I have paid him on said contract. 3^d I will and bequeath unto all my brothers and sisters equally all my other land except what I have willed to my brother Zelek with this exception that my brother John is to have an interest of one hundred Dollars more in the land than any of the rest or they are to pay him the said hundred Dollars in four payments of twenty five Dollars per year for four years. But upon reflection I will that whosoever of my Brothers or Sisters shall have the care and expense of my Mother during her life I wish to have the benefit of my Land (except that devised to Zelek) while my Mother lives and also except the hundred Dollars which I have devised to my brother John and I wish my Mother to have the right to make Chaise which one or more of her Children she will live with. I also will and bequeath eight Dollars out of my personal estate to Emily Maynard and last of all I constitute and appoint Zelek Maynard my executor of this my last Will and Testament.
