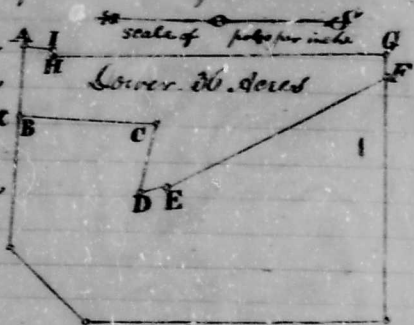


North 88 West of pole to a stake another of birchwood, thence South 45 West 48 poles to a stake, thence South 16 East 14 1/2 poles to a stake, thence North 55 East 20 poles to a dead oak and Elm log, thence South 16 West 15 1/2 poles to a stake, thence South 16 East 3 poles to a stone, thence South 16 East 13 poles to the beginning, containing 36 acres.

And the said Survey Commence as follows, to wit; (see plot) Beginning at A. an Elm, thence North 88 West 31 poles to B. a stake in Division fence thence with said fence South 8 West 62 poles to C. a stone in the bush road, thence with said road North 7 1/2 West 23 poles to D. a stone thence South 6 East 12 poles passing the west corner of the garden to E. a stone, thence South 2 1/2 East 17 poles to F. an Elm in the original line thence with said line North 88 West 15 1/2 poles to G. a dead oak and Elm log, thence North 16 West 15 1/2 poles to H. a stake, thence North 55 East 20 poles to a stone, thence North 16 East 13 poles to the beginning, containing 36 acres.

Harding's
Settlement

May 26th 1833

Pursuant to an order from the Nicholas County Court, we as directed as Commissioners to settle with R. Harding the Administrator of John Harding Decd. after being sworn, proceeded to settle as follows, to wit; First we find a balance of the first settlement in the hands of the Administrator, of the sum of \$120.54 The accounts against the estate paid by Richard Harding Decd to one Note B. L. of Miller Hagen first bond \$125.02 To one fee bill C. C. Clark \$2 5.48 To one bill of exchange to one sum of \$100 \$100 7.15

Richard Harding account of services and taxes \$11.20 Commissioners accounts of services \$52.15 Balance struck \$68.39

We find in the hands of the Administrator of John Harding Decd. the sum of \$108.79 cents - Given under our hands and seals L. M. Parks & Charles Nichols

Parks Pursuant to an order of the Nicholas County Court, made at the 2nd May Term 1833, appointing us the undersigned, to settle with John Keller Administrator on the estate of Stephen Miller Decd. We have proceeded to perform said duty, and report the following statement as the result. To wit;

The Administrator, to the Estate L. Balance found remaining in his hands upon settlement heretofore made with the kind, and admitted to record by Court 17th May 1832 \$272.95 To interest on debt of John Smith settled in former settlement, Smith's Decd's Repairs bond \$258.99 from 2nd May 1825 to 2nd May 1831. 157.65 Attd \$2270.54
