ted to appraise Henry D. Howerton his portion of negroes agreeable to his  
grandfather's will, we have met this day above written at the house of  
Edmund S. Baker in Nicholas County & after viewing said negroes  
proceeding to appraise Henry D. Howerton the negro woman by the name  
of Nancy which we value at \$1200. also one negro girl by the name of  
Mildred which we value at \$312.50. And Henry D. Howerton agreed  
to pay over to Elizabeth Howerton his sister twenty five dollars, so soon  
as she arrives at the age of twenty one years old to make her portion of  
negroes equal with his. Given under our hands this 8th day  
of February 1830.
